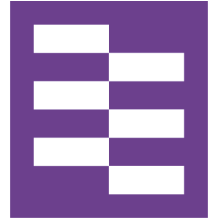

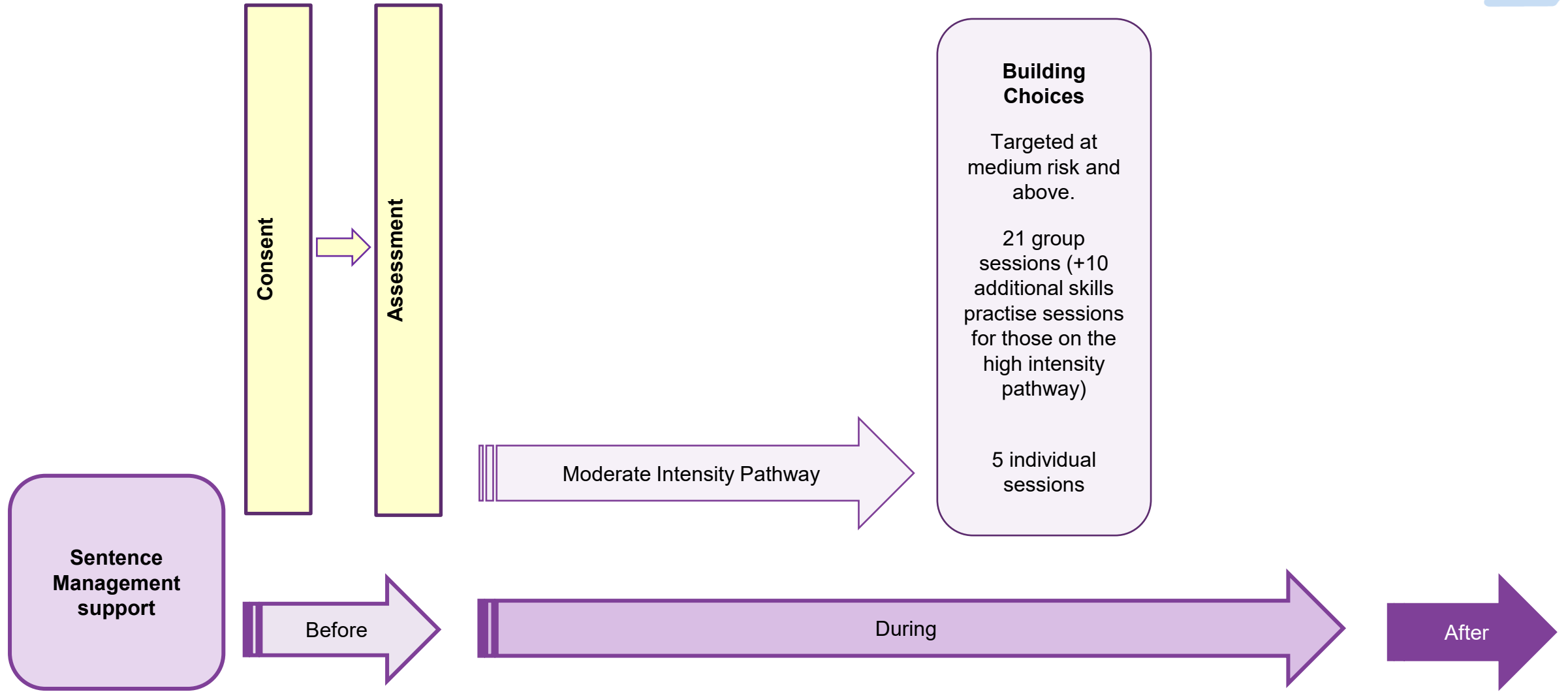
Lord Chancellor's Statement

- On 12th February, the Lord Chancellor, Shabana Mahmood, made a statement announcing a range of measures being implemented to reduce the current operational pressures on Probation and strengthen its capacity to focus on those offenders with the highest risk of reoffending and harm. She announced measures to:
 - free up more staff time to prioritise work with highest risk cases
 - recruit more probation practitioners
 - introduce greater use of technology to support workload reduction
 - deal with a backlog in Accredited Programmes delivery by prioritising those who are considered to pose the greatest risk
- The Chief Probation Officer, Kim Thornden-Edwards, advised:
 - "We recognise that staff are working above capacity, that is why we are putting in place a programme of measures called 'Our Future Probation Service' which will help alleviate staff workload and enable our truly amazing probation practitioners to focus on effective working with the offenders who pose the greatest risk."

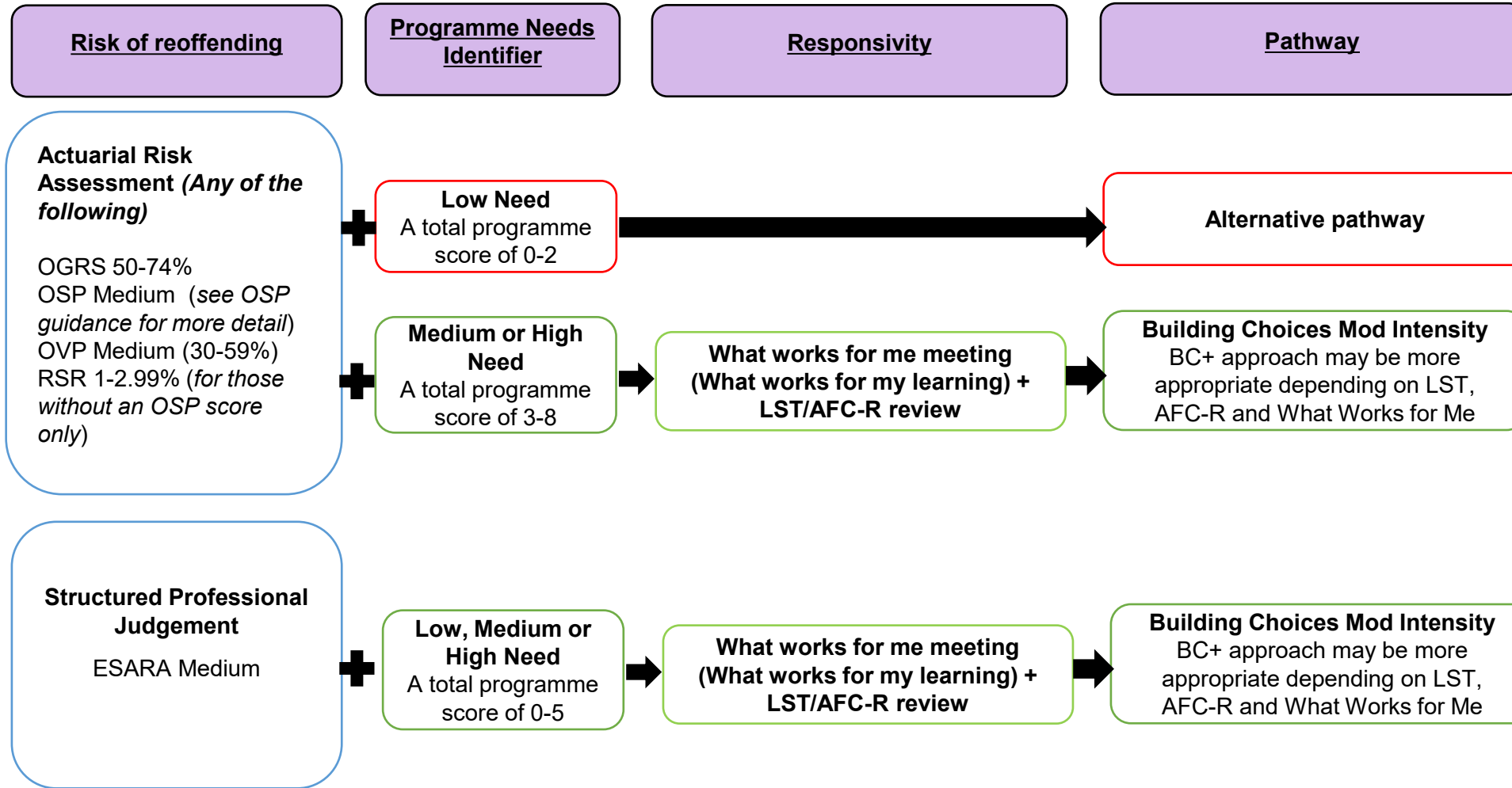
What does this mean for accredited programmes?

- A key measure includes changes to how Accredited Programmes requirements will be targeted in the short term through a tightening of our current eligibility criteria both pre and post sentence.
- From the 14th of February our Pre-Sentence Report proposals will reflect those changes when we are advising on eligibility for and availability of our current Accredited Programme suite.
 1. For cases where 'domestic abuse' is an offence factor and the SARA score is medium or above, someone must also score either:
 - RSR 3+ or OGRS 50+ or ROSH is High or Very High.
 2. For cases where 'sexual' is an offence factor and they have an index sexual offence type and qualifying OSP scores, someone must also score either
 - RSR 3+ or OGRS 50+ or ROSH is High or Very High.
 3. For all other cohorts, they must have:
 - OGRS 50+ and either an RSR score of 3+ or ROSH is High or Very High.
- This process has been implemented, and all new orders are now subject to the above criteria, the impact is that only the higher risk cases are being sentenced to a programme requirement (in the short term).

Section 3: What works for my learning?

Understanding **strengths and areas of support across learning needs:**

- Communication
- Memory
- Sensory
- Speed of understanding
- Behaviour

- Reading and writing

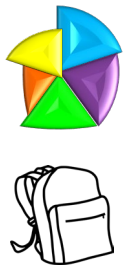

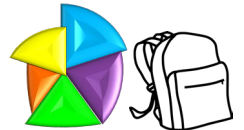

People Around Me 1:1

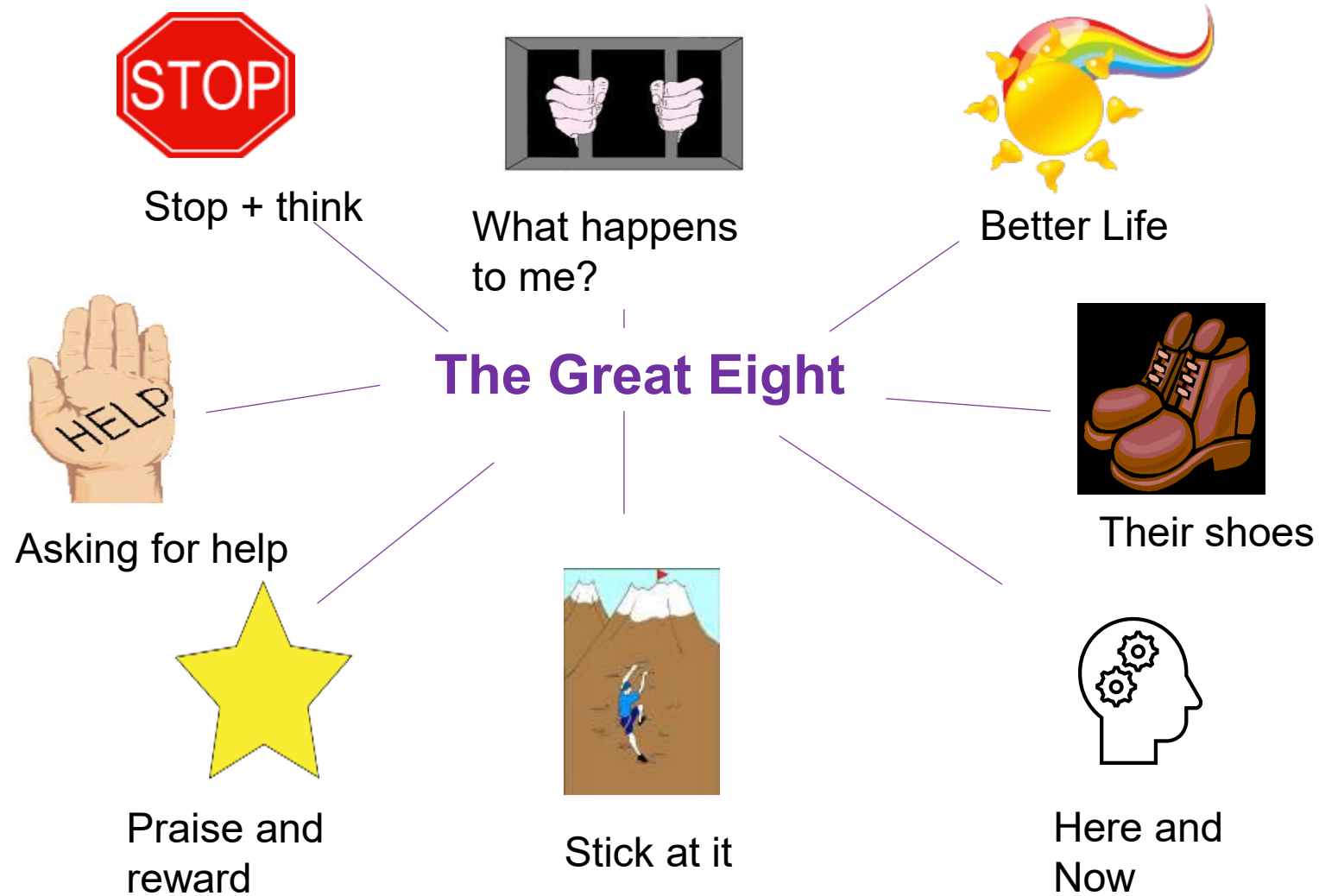
Bringing it all Together (3 sessions)

Great Eight: Skills for Strengthening Future Me



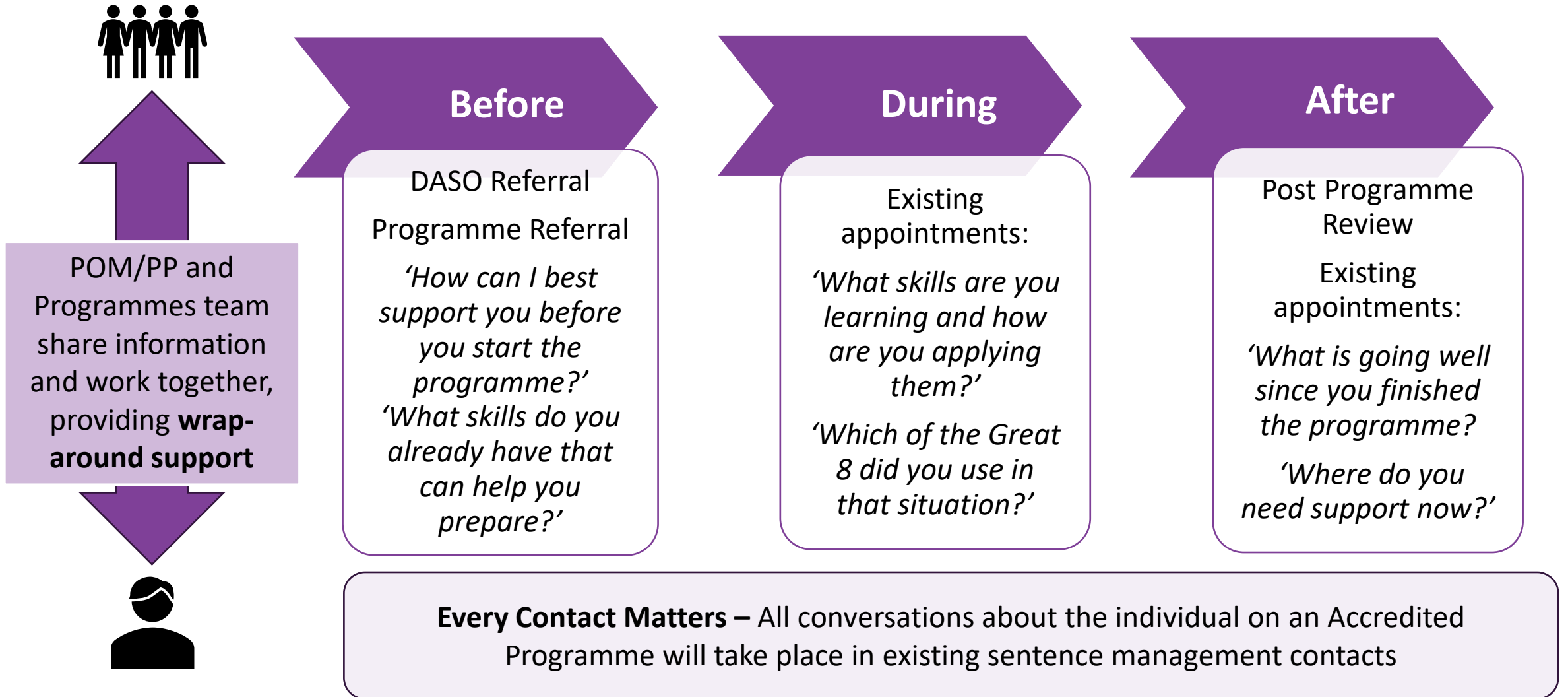
Moving Forward: *Supporting the Accredited Programme Journey*
