## Welcome from Police and Crime Commissioner, Festus Akinbusoye

Hello everyone and welcome to the third edition of the newsletter since I was elected as Police and Crime commissioner. I have had a very busy and productive month and I'm really pleased to share an update with you, as we edge closer to the launch of the Police and Crime plan.

#### Inviting the public to have their say

I launched the Public Consultation survey at the beginning of July where I invited the people of Bedfordshire to share their views on local concerns and issues. We had an amazing response and I wanted to say thank you to all of you that completed it. Your feedback is invaluable in helping my team and I shape the forthcoming Police and Crime Plan.

#### Countdown is on...Police and Crime Plan launch

Once all of the feedback is gathered, I will be launching the Police and Crime Plan for 2021 – 2024 on 18<sup>th</sup> August 2021. I'm looking forward to officially sharing the plan with colleagues, residents and partners. The main purpose of the Police and Crime Plan is to set policing priorities, hold the Chief Constable accountable for effective policing and ultimately keep the residents of Bedfordshire safe, which remains my main priority and focus.

I have been very passionate about getting this right, spending time with as many individuals and groups as I can to understand the challenges we face across Bedfordshire and doing my research before committing to a final plan. I wanted to thank each and every one of you that I have had the opportunity



to speak directly with as the time spent speaking with you all in the last three months has proved of great value in aiding my research for the plan.

#### 100 day report

On Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> August, I will be launching my 100 Day Report, which will also highlight the new Police and Crime Plan. On reaching the end of my first 100 days, I have detailed the progress that the

Office of Police and Crime Commissioner has delivered against the pledges and priorities set out in my manifesto alongside the collaborative work with our partners. Again, I want to thank you all for your support in working together with my team and I hope you will agree lots has been achieved by working together building a shared vision.

#### Violence Reduction meetings

A strong theme that has been apparent in the last three months has been addressing serious violence in Luton. One of my pledges was to tackle the causes of crimes and focus on early intervention. To show my commitment to this, I hosted three Violence Reduction meetings alongside the Leader of Luton Council, Hazel Simmons and Local Policing teams. We had great representation from partners,



councillors and residents. Feedback from these events has further shaped the Police and Crime Plan including allocating £150,000 to early intervention programmes for young people. These events have proved so valuable that my team are now progressing similar ones throughout the county in the coming months. More <a href="here.">here</a>.

#### Summer of Fun and Focus

Following on from the above and in response to community meetings and feedback from residents and young people, this has resulted in the launch of our Summer of Fun and Focus, funded by the OPCC. The programme gives young people between the ages of 4 and 16 the opportunity to learn skills in focus, confidence and health by attending Boxing and Martial Arts Classes. 


