### **Community Meetings**

This month I have hosted multiple community meetings including the Annual Parish Council Conference. The meeting saw Town, Parish and Ward councillors from across Bedfordshire coming together to discuss issues in their local area. Our parish councillors have been key in maintaining contact with our communities throughout the pandemic, providing them with a crucial point of contact through which they can raise community priorities. Having this quality time together was priceless and I wanted to once again thank everybody for their participation and feedback. There is always work to do but their passion for their communities never ceases to amaze me.

#### **ASB Conference**

On Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> November 2021, I will be joining partners and professionals at Bedfordshire's ASB conference. We will be hearing from ASB practitioners discussing tools and powers to tackle the causes of ASB (anti-social behaviour) and learn from past experiences and case studies.

### Schools Debate

As part of my election campaign, I pledged to run an annual school debating competition for children aged between 15-18 years old. I am delighted that we are proceeding with this event for pupils and we very much welcome all schools to participate. The debates provide a good opportunity for young people to develop their confidence, public speaking skills and also broaden their knowledge of social issues. It's going to be a fun experience for all involved.

#### Speed Watch

Speed Watch is an educational scheme aimed at raising awareness of speed restrictions and encouraging drivers to reduce their speed to the legal speed limit. I recently provided funding for new Speed Indication Devices (SIDS) for the Speed Watch team who came to showcase them to me and my office. The devices provide an instant visible notification of the speed the motorist is travelling at. Those captured speeding receive a warning letter from Bedfordshire Police and persistent offenders' details are passed to the local policing team for further action. I'd like to thank all the Speed Watch volunteers for their help in keeping our roads safer. Our Speed Watch volunteers generously donate their time helping to make their communities a safer place.

# **Signpost**

Signpost Hub support those affected by crime in Bedfordshire, putting victims at the heart of everything they do. The hub offers free and confidential support to anyone affected by crime, whether it has been reported to the police or not. This includes victims themselves,



bereaved relatives, parents or guardians of victims under 18 and members of staff where a business has been the subject of a crime.

When you report a crime to the police you will be asked a few questions to find out how you have been affected by the crime and your personal circumstances, to see if there is any additional support that you might need. Signpost will use this information to decide the best way to support you.

Whether you have recently been affected by a crime or are experiencing delayed impact from a past crime, they are able to help you understand what has happened and how to cope and recover from what can be a traumatic experience.

Their experienced staff and volunteers know what emotions and challenges you may be going through. They are specially trained to listen to you and give you help and advice.

Signpost offers practical and emotional support to those impacted by crime living in Bedfordshire, regardless of when and where the crime occurred. If you need support, please call Signpost on 0800 0282 887 and speak to one of their specialist team of Victim Care Coordinators.
