This will build on the work started in the summer to engage these young people and provide support work in the form of activities, talks, local visits, and work towards involving young people to contribute to finding an indoor venue for the future.</p> <p>The program will provide the opportunity for young people who do not access structured youth activities to engage with adults who can offer advice, support and guidance in their community settings.</p> <p>The aim of the council is to provide this as an ongoing service for years to come</p>

The interventions will be led by people who mainly live in the more deprived areas of Bedfordshire and who have less opportunities.</p> <p>The main benefit of Bsafe is to ensure that young people are looking at the drivers of crime and gang violence, carrying out research then communicating to their peers, family, friends, youth groups schools and colleges with what they see as the solutions.</p>

Blues Foundation	Tackle Life	£7,500	Bedford	<p>Launched in April 2020 with the aspiration to become one of Bedfordshire's leading sports charities. With aim to use the values of rugby to promote positive life choices and the Tackle LIFE project will do exactly that. Passionate about the impact sport and exercise can have and the programme is designed to support the young people explore their own personal development. Partnered with several organisations with specialisms in tackling issues in youth crime, exploitation and vulnerabilities. The delivery of the programme is supported by staff with experience in working with the target audience on similar programmes in Luton and north London. The Tackle LIFE Project is a new initiative by the Blues Foundation, launching in Bedford in 2021, using rugby values and sport to engage disengaged young people at risk of offending. Working with key partners, this early intervention programme aims to inspire and transform the lives of young people at risk, using wellbeing is at the heart of the delivery. The project will be a bespoke service to the young people identified by Bedford Borough Council's ART, Bedfordshire Police, the Young Offending Service, and local secondary schools. This alternative opportunity to learn and develop will target the young people most at need, but also those on a support pathway to reduce the risk of crime and exploitation.</p>

Working in high schools, alternative learning provisions and in the community delivering group work and 1-1 support for young people, predominately 10-18-year olds. Directional staff have been a voice for young people, representing the town on various media outlets (BBC News, ITV News, BBC Three Counties) and hope to continue to create opportunities for the most vulnerable young people. Currently, our ability to receive Air Ambulance depends on them landing on a field, some distance away on a field, subsequently requiring a

				secondary land transfer to the hospital. The ability to save lives is consequently impeded by the inability to provide a rapid response to the hospital's emergency department, as the speed in which a patient receives medical treatment is crucial
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
