AS CHIEF CONSTABLE OF BEDFORDSHIRE

1 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1.1 This document constitutes the report and recommendations of the Bedfordshire Police and Crime Panel in respect of the proposed appointment of Trevor Rodenhurst to the Office of Chief Constable of Bedfordshire and is submitted to the Commissioner in accordance with the requirements of Schedule 8 to the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011.
- 1.2 The report recommends that Trevor Rodenhurst be appointed Chief Constable of Bedfordshire.
- 1.3 In submitting its report, the Panel would like to thank Mr Rodenhurst for his attendance at the confirmation hearing on 12 December 2022 and to congratulate him on his appointment.

2 CONFIRMATION HEARING

- 2.1 On 2 December 2022 the Panel's Secretariat received formal notification from the Commissioner's Office of Mr Rodenhurst's proposed appointment. By law the Panel is required to hold a confirmation hearing (a meeting of the Panel held in public at which the candidate for appointment is requested to appear for the purpose of answering questions relating to that appointment) in sufficient time to enable it to submit its report and recommendations in respect of the proposed appointment to the Commissioner within three weeks of the day on which it received notification.
- 2.2 The confirmation hearing into this appointment was held at 6.30pm on 12 December 2022 at Borough Hall, Bedford. The following Panel Members were present:

2.3 Members of the Panel questioned Mr Rodenhurst in relation to his proposed appointment and considered his responses to their questions and other information supplied to the Panel by the Commissioner in accordance with the requirements of Schedule 8 of the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011. This information comprised:

- the criteria used to assess the suitability of the candidate for the appointment;
- why the candidate satisfies those criteria;
- the terms and conditions on which the candidate is to be appointed.

In addition to this information, at the request of the Panel, the Commissioner also provided:

- The report of the independent member on the selection panel
- The College of Policing Guidance for appointing chief officers
- The recruitment pack
- Competency and Values Framework
- A timetable for the recruitment process

2.4. The Panel also noted that the report provided by the Independent Member Carolyn Dhanraj MBE JP on the recruitment panel, indicated that she was satisfied that the PCC fulfilled his responsibility to ensure the assessment process put in place was in accordance with the responsibilities listed in the College of Policing Guidance. He was also confident that the recruitment panel performed their duty to challenge and assess the candidate in a manner that was fair, transparent and merit based.

3 RECOMMENDATION

3.1 That the appointment of Trevor Rodenhurst to the post of Chief Constable of Bedfordshire on the terms and conditions set out in the report submitted to the Panel be confirmed.

4 REPORT PUBLICATION ARRANGEMENTS

4.1 The Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011 requires the Panel to publish this report in such manner as the Panel determines.

4.2 The Panel wishes to allow the Commissioner time to receive and consider this report, convey its contents to the candidate and consider the response he wishes to make to the report, before it is published. This reflects the guidance on confirmation hearings provided by the Local Government Association, which envisages a time lapse between a hearing and the release of information about the Panel's recommendations.

4.3 In recognition of this, the Panel will not publish this report or provide any comment on the outcome of the hearing until noon on Monday 19 December 2022 or until confirmation is received from the Commissioner, whichever is sooner, following which a press release will be issued and the report will be published on the Panel's webpages at: www.bedford.gov.uk/bedspcp
